EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The City of Haslet Parks Board requested proposals for the replacement of existing playground equipment (approximately 18 years old) at the Community Park. The selected contractor/vendor will provide design, materials, removal, installation, and associated services for a new playground targeting children ages 7–14 years old.

Approximate cost \$500,000

Scope of work-
 Project Components & Requirements

1. Playground Equipment & Features

The proposed design should include, at a minimum, the following elements:

- Zip Line System
 - o Double zip line configuration
 - o One standard seat and one ADA-accessible (bucket-style) seat
 - o Accessible entry/exit for limited mobility users

- Stand-Alone Web Climbing Structure
 - o Vendor to specify overall height
 - o May Include option for ADA-accessible ramp or transfer system
 - o Provide separate pricing for accessibility add-on

- Main Playground Structure
 - o Central feature with 1 tower
 - o Target height: 20–25 feet or 30 feet if available-

- o Integrated shade structures/covers
- Slides
 - o 3–4 total slides
 - o Combination of straight and curved designs
 - o At least one slide with open access entry
- Monkey Bars
- Spinning Elements
 - o Four spinners for group and individual play

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

KOMPAN established the FitBLOCK Fund to support communities across the country in bringing real outdoor fitness spaces to people of all ages and abilities. With up to \$2 million available, this program is making it easier than ever to bring world-class, low-maintenance fitness solutions to your community.

FitBLOCK is a universally designed outdoor fitness solution built to activate outdoor spaces and encourage everyday movement. Its all-in-one design eliminates barriers such as complicated equipment and expensive gym memberships, making fitness accessible and community-centered.

FitBLOCK Fund is open from May 1 through June 30, 2026

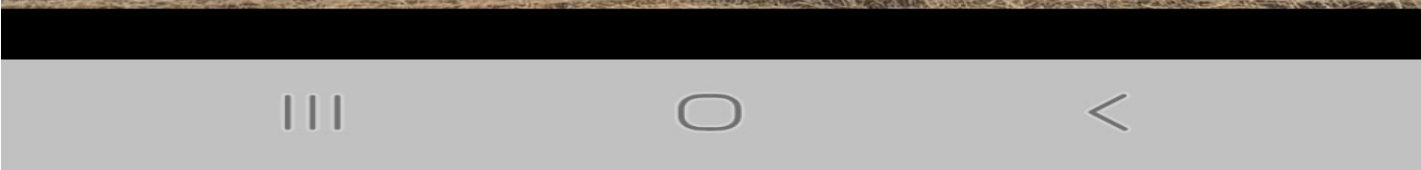
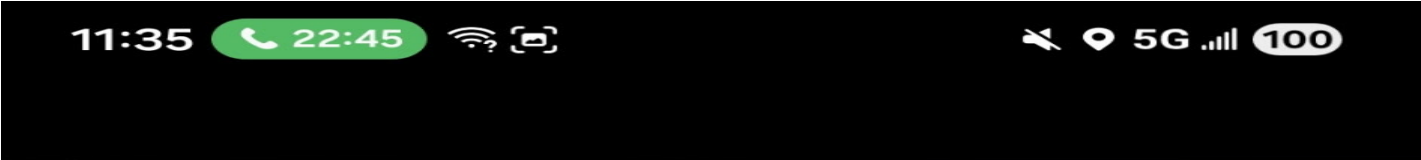
BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The iconic giant, whimsical troll statues scattered across the globe are made by Thomas Dambo, a Danish recycle-art activist. He is internationally famous for building these larger-than-life sculptures entirely out of recycled materials, such as scrap wood and discarded pallets and hiding them in forest and cities around the world. His whimsical, environmentally conscious creations have become major public art installations worldwide. Notable characteristics and facts about his troll sculptures include:

- **Locations:** There are well over 150 Dambo trolls across the globe, spanning the US, Denmark, South Korea, China, Australia, and Puerto Rico
- **The Mission:** Dambo's "Waste No More" philosophy aims to inspire communities to see discarded trash as a valuable resource and encourages people to explore nature
- **Community-led construction:** These sculptures are created through collaboration, with volunteers working alongside the artist and his team to construct the troll from reclaimed wood. It's a unique opportunity to be part of an international public art project while learning new skills and working together with neighbors, students, and visitors.

To get a Thomas Dambo troll installed in a local park, the municipality, a local arts non-profit, or a park conservancy must officially commission the artist. Thomas Dambo's giant recycled trolls are funded by a mix of city tourism taxes, private donors, non-profit organizations, and community sponsorships. Projects can cost between \$300,000 and \$500,000, and host cities or sponsors typically handle the expenses. Maintenance costs average \$3,000 to \$5,000 annually.

Thomas Dambo's trolls last anywhere from a few months to 15+ years depending on installation and maintenance. Because they are crafted from 100% recycled materials and reclaimed wood, they are meant to eventually return to nature.
