Town Board Member _____ offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, for many years, the Irondequoit Recreation Department offers summer programs for the children of Town residents and Woodcraft Camp is one of these offerings; and

WHEREAS, the Town's Building Maintenance Department has suggested that the flooring of the Woodcraft Camp building Town Board is in need of improvement and has recommended that the floor be repaired and sealed; and

WHEREAS, the Town has received 3 quotes for the necessary service and Garage Floor Coatings quoted the lowest fee in the amount of \$15,200 (see **Attachment A**); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board finds that the Improvement is a Type II action for purposes of the State Environmental Quality Review Act because the action involves the maintenance or repair of existing facilities or structures (6 NYCRR §617.5[c][1], replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility in kind on the same site (6 NYCRR §617.5[c][2]. These actions will not have a significant impact on the environment and therefore are not subject to SEQRA review; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wants to allocate funding for this project through ARAP monies budget line A2907110-520120, and this use of ARPA funds has been approved by the Town's ARPA consultants, The Bonadio Group.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board allocates ARPA funds to the Improvements in the amount of \$15,200.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board authorizes a contract with Garage Floor Coatings for the necessary repair and sealing services in the amount of \$15,200.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute any and all documents, subject to approval by the Attorney for the Town, related to this authorization.

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Article 7 Updates 10.31.2025

Section 109 Licensing of Dogs:

- Section 109.1(c) verbiage has been added to include voluntary contributions by the licensee to the local municipal shelter or other shelter that has a contract for shelter services with the municipality.
- Section 109.4 stipulates the distribution of the contributions collected.

Section 109.1(c)

...The application shall include space where an owner may elect to make a contribution in support of the pound or shelter managed by the municipality where the owner resides or any organization which is contracted by such municipality to provide animal shelter services. The space for contribution shall be clearly marked and distinct with bold lettering or on a separate page, to make clear it is a voluntary contribution and not a part of the license fee. The application shall list the organization in which the contribution will be sent and may list suggested reasonable contribution amounts with an option for any amount. Municipalities may also require additional information on such application as deemed appropriate...

Section 109.4

Municipalities shall deposit all monies collected from voluntary contributions pursuant to paragraph (c) of subdivision one of this section into a dedicated fund. The proceeds of such fund shall be properly accounted for and be given to the organization listed on the application annually. In no event shall the funds derived from voluntary contributions replace any existing funding commitments to such organizations.

Section 123 Dangerous Dogs: The penal law has been revised

Section 123.11

The owner shall not be liable pursuant to subdivision six, seven, eight, nine or ten of this section if the dog was coming to the aid or defense of a person during the commission or attempted commission of a murder, robbery, burglary, arson, rape in the first degree as defined in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision one, paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision two or paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision three of section 130.35 of the penal law, rape in the first degree as defined in the former subdivision one of section 130.35 of the penal law, a crime formerly defined in subdivision one or two of section 130.50 of the penal law or kidnapping within the dwelling or upon the real property of the owner of the dog and the dog injured or killed the person committing such criminal activity.
