Monthly Report

Month(s): May - June 2026

White Valley
Community Centre

- Roof repairs: Ongoing removal of maple seed pods and organic debris from roof surfaces and surrounding grounds to mitigate blockage risks. Existing roof drains are undersized, and roof drainage is not optimal. Improvements planned for mid-June being managed by RDNO.
- Some flooding in hall A in mid-May during a heavy rainstorm was the result of a clogged and failed roof drain – repairs to the hall walls will be completed once roof work is done, but the hall is operating at full functionality in the meantime. A restoration contractor has performed necessary repairs to keep the building functional for the public till the roof repairs are completed.
- Annual commercial kitchen hood cleaning taking place in June, as well as the bi-annual fire suppression hood recertification being completed.

Pat Duke Memorial
Arena

- Two Refrigeration Operator (RO) positions have been posted on indeed, Civic Info and the RFABC websites to attract the best candidates for these positions and there have been several applicants apply to date. The role requires specialized certification and the ability to operate arena systems and small ground-maintenance equipment. Applications are to be reviewed to start the interview process to fill the positions. With anticipation of positions filled by mid-August, to allow some supervision and assessment time of these applicants working outdoors before they go into the arena for the Fall/ Winter season.
- Annual arena ammonia cooling tower descaling work taking place in June before the hot Summer weather arrives.
- Structural Assessment: A contractor will conduct a structural evaluation of the north end of the arena due to cracking in the cinderblock walls indicated possible movement. The Minor Hockey sea-can must be removed to enable the assessment and bring the site into compliance with local bylaws. Arena staff are currently working with the Minor Hockey group to find temporary storage of contents of the shipping container in the arena, to allow the permanent removal of the shipping

	<p>container off site and a future off-site storage location of these items can be arranged.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fire alarm panel relocated from the ice plant room to the public lobby to meet accessibility and code requirements. Quotes for additional horn strobes being added to the West side of the arena in the shop and office areas to the new fire panel to follow for additional fire code compliance in the arena. • Annual commercial kitchen hood cleaning taking place in June in the cafeteria, as well as the bi-annual fire suppression hood recertification being completed.
<p>Outdoor Pool / Spray Park</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The spray park foot activated sensors were malfunctioning making it so the public could not turn on the spray park. These sensors have since been replaced and the spray park is working as per normal. • The outdoor pool water is perfectly balanced and the public is enjoying the outdoor pool space for the season.
<p>White Valley Parks</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parks & Recreation crews are maintaining and keeping these parks beautiful for the public to use.
<p>Lumby Curling Club</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Replacement of a damaged exterior metal double doors on the north side is completed. Insulation that previously existed over these exterior metal double doors has been removed and will not be put back, so the Lumby Curling Club building is fire code compliant. The fire inspector has been notified. • Annual commercial kitchen hood cleaning taking place in June, as well as the bi-annual fire suppression hood recertification being completed.
