- 2) Nowhere in the proposed list of possible money saving ideas did I read the rescinding of dept heads' salary increases that were recently approved. Wouldn't one think that this would be a major way for our city to save revenue——do not allow one raise to go forward until our budget is balanced and this massive deficit is resolved.
