BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES (OLD BUSINESS)

UPDATE FROM THE 100-YEAR VISION SPECIALIST

The Chair provided an update on federal grant applications submitted. She also reported meeting with representatives of the Terrace Community Foundation to explore potential funding opportunities, including a possible application in the fall. Working groups for wayfinding, public art, and heritage have been established, with initial priorities focused on the heritage group. Preliminary budget discussions have been held with City staff. The Chair further advised that she had spoken with the media regarding a newspaper article.

NEW BUSINESS

Wayfinding

Discussion took place regarding the selected gateway sign designs and the company responsible for preparing the plans. Further discussions will be undertaken to review materials and associated costs.

Public Art and Infrastructure

Staff have conducted discussions regarding ongoing surveys and infrastructure planning. With potential sponsors in mind, a member shared a concept for a canoe-themed art installation to be constructed from aluminum. The Committee anticipates a forthcoming meeting to further define the project scope.

Murals

The possibility of a mural on the Safeway building was discussed, and it was noted that the manager has been contacted. A member also advised that the owner of the Gobind Mall has been approached regarding a potential mural on their building.

Consideration was given to adding vehicle directional signage to the project scope, with further inquiry into associated costs to be undertaken. Project scoping, through the Public Works & Engineering Department, is expected to be completed by July 6.

An inquiry was made into the Riverboat Days Society's plans in relation to the Centennial. It was shared that the Society is considering incorporating a historical theme into its drone show.

A review of the proposed budget took place, with final grant figures anticipated by the end of July.

A community choir concert with a historical theme was proposed as part of a potential Centennial music event.

Discussion occurred regarding commemorative promotional items featuring Centennial branding, including T-shirts, pins, stickers, flags, tents, banners, and wooden medallions on lanyards. A member volunteered to obtain pricing for these items.

An update was provided that local schools have been contacted regarding the Centennial logo contest, which is scheduled to conclude at the end of July.

Participation in Riverboat Days through a float or booth presence was suggested. The Chair indicated she would consult with staff regarding feasibility. Joining the Tourism Terrace booth was also suggested should space be limited.

Potential involvement of the Terrace Little Theatre in presenting a play as part of Centennial programming was discussed. The Terrace Heritage Park Museum Society was identified as a potential partner for future planning discussions.

The Terrace Heritage Park Museum Society was brought up for a possible meeting regarding the Centennial planning.

Skeena Diversity has expressed interest in promoting and participating in Centennial events.
