7 NEW BUSINESS

a) Updates on Activities - Chief Lecky

Chief Lecky highlighted recent activities, including his attendance at the OACP Small/Mid Conference, FONOM, participation in Sexual Assault Prevention Week with TPS staff, and meetings with TDH to address concerns and work through policy issues, including mental health concerns.

This week marks Police Week, with several planned events for both the community and TPS staff, including an open house, cake, displays, and recruiting initiatives. It is also Road Safety Week, with a community ride program in action.

The Chief also met with Timmins and Porcupine Search and Rescue to discuss various initiatives, with more information to come.

Additionally, the IAC is preparing items to be showcased at TPS.

b) Board Chair Updates - Chair Grenke

Chair Grenke shared that he attended FONOM and connected with fellow Board

colleagues. He recognized Police Week, expressing gratitude to the Chief and the service for their dedication to keeping the community safe. The Chair also acknowledged the passing of Sergeant Brendon Malcom from the OPP detachment and offered his condolences.

c) Statistical Report - Deputy Chief Dinel

Deputy Chief Dinel reviewed the report, noting a decrease in January followed by increases in February and March. He also highlighted a steady decline over the past four years and confirmed that, at this point, there are no notable concerns.
